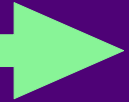

NEGATIVE PEACE



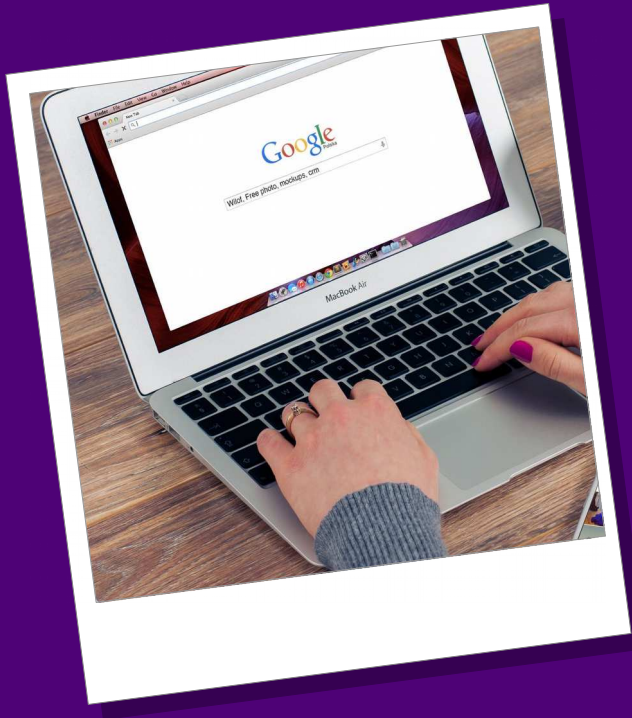
